



### **EXPLORE** THE HEART OF PEI'S ACADIAN REGION

Home to the iconic West Point Lighthouse, in the North Cape region you can also experience authentic Acadian music, food, heritage and culture. "Up West", as the locals call it, offers community museums, the work of local artists, artisans and craftspersons, Acadian festivals and events, and a chance to explore the early life of Canadian country and folk music legend Stompin' Tom Connors. North Cape Coastal Drive is also where you'll find Summerside — its listings are at the end of this section of the guide — PEI's second largest city, populated with historical properties bearing the Lefurgey and Wyatt names, and where you can catch performances or train in traditional Celtic performing arts among other cultural highlights.

The Alberton Arts & Heritage Centre is a de-commissioned church which is now used to host cultural, educational and entertainment events which include, but are not limited to, music, theatre, art shows, lecture series, and museum displays. The building has a traditional Gothic church style including pointed arch

windows on the side elevations and in the tower. The tower also features a decorative entrance vestibule and four finials on its roof. The church remained active from 1927-2005 when it was closed for regular services due to a decline in membership and difficulty in obtaining a minister.

PEI's first people are the Mi'kmaq, with a rich history dating back 10,000 years. Each summer, celebrations open to all are held to showcase the culture of the Island's Indigenous people. Pow wows usually take place in Scotchfort the second weekend in June, in Panmure Island the second weekend in August, and in Lennox Island the third weekend in August. National Indigenous Peoples Day is observed on June 21st, with St. Anne's Sunday typically celebrated on the last Sunday of July in Lennox Island with a parade, pageant, and other festivities.


